



Gracemere Market Report 04/10/2019



A yarding of 2145 cattle came to hand at Gracemere sale today, comprising 770 steers, 390 cows, 910 heifers, 10 cows and calves, and 30 bulls. The market for prime cattle was stronger today for bullocks and cows, while the feeder cattle also sold to a stronger market. Weaner cattle saw the steers dearer, while the weaner heifers also met with better demand.
